Lucky dip - 50p a go, a prize every time.

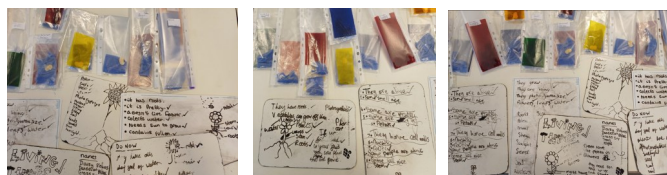
In the courtyard at lunchtime:
