This term, Year 7 students have explored the mark-making processes of Impressionist/post-impressionist artists from the late 1800s. From the meticulous stippling of Georges Seurat to the expressive brushstrokes of Vincent van Gogh, students were encouraged to experiment with a range of techniques and apply this understanding to their own work.

The landscapes in this collection are drawn from locations around the school grounds. Working from these familiar spaces allowed students to build a more personal connection to their subject matter, which sits at the heart of Impressionist painting, where emotion, atmosphere, and light are just as important as what is being seen.

As a group, they embraced the opportunity to work outside and respond directly to their surroundings, capturing not just what these places look like, but how they feel. The outcomes reflect a growing confidence in their mark-making, as well as an increasing willingness to take creative risks and interpret the world in their own way.

This project reflects the value of creating meaningful, relatable starting points for students, showing how familiar environments can be reimagined through new techniques and ideas.
