



Unlocking Potential for Our Community

Dear Parents/Carers

As you may be aware from the news, negotiations between the Department for Education and the teaching unions were not successful and the National Education Union has announced two more days of industrial action on Weds 5th and Friday 7th July. I am writing to inform you about arrangements for both these days. This action arises from a dispute between the government and the NEU over teachers' pay and school funding at a national level.

Sturminster Newton High School will be open to all students in Year 12 and school transport will be provided for all students in this category as normal. Year 12 students will need to pre-order any food from the canteen in advance – an email is being sent to the students direct. Please be aware that the school will be closed to all students in years 7, 8 and 9. Students in Year 10 will continue with their Work Experience placements.

I have not taken this decision lightly. Our priority is to ensure a safe and secure environment for students and based on the information available we would be unable to provide this with the staff we have on site and available to work. Staff who are not taking industrial action will set work on google classroom so students will be able to log on from home but there will be no live lessons. I would ask that all students check google classroom and complete work set. Work will not be set by staff taking industrial action. Work is also available via these links:
